Double Stroked Text in Illustrator

Using the illustrations as a guide, follow the directions to complete this project.

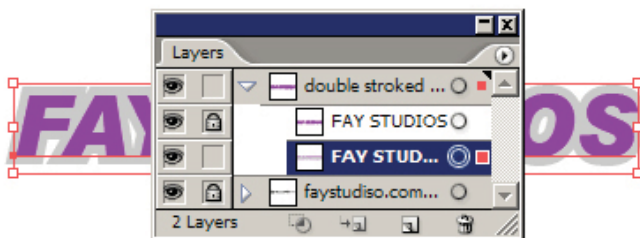


- Type in your name. (It is obviously not "Fay Studios . . ." Change font style, size and fill color.

- In the Layers Palette choose Duplicate "name of layer" from the fly out menu (small triangle arrow). You will now have two layers with the exact same text.

- Lock the top layer (optional). Choose the bottom layer of your text making sure there is a square to the right of the dot in the layers menu indicating that you actually HAVE that layer selected.

- Add the first stroke color (in this case gray and 10pt). It will be the middle color of your final three color text. Since it is below (behind) your text you can watch it expand behind your original text.

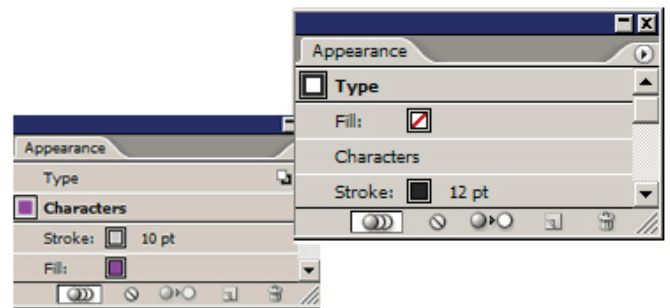


- In the Appearance Palette choose Type and from the fly out menu choose Add New Stroke.

- Drag the new stroke BELOW the Character listing in the Appearance Palette.

- Adjust the sizing of this new (outmost) stroke until it is the size you want.

- You have ONE stroke at the Character level and one at the Type level.



- You can make adjustments to your fills and strokes from within the Layers Palette.
